Ward Priorities

1. Road Safety

- Several complaints were received regarding the parking of vehicles in relation to the building site, Main Street, Gullane. On the occasions when Police attended they were parked legally. Site Manager has also been spoke to. A TTRO in now in place this will be monitored by ELC traffic Wardens
- In the afternoon of Friday 3rd May, police received a call regarding an overturned vehicle on the road between Whitekirk and Brownrigg Farm. Driver taken to ERI by ambulance for precaution only

2. Antisocial Behaviour

- A report of boy racers in the car park at Yellowcraigs was received. Police made aware and will give the area passing attention.
- In the early hours of Saturday 27th April, a car was damaged whilst parked on Templar Lane, Gullane. Details taken and enquiries ongoing.
- During the evening of Friday 24th May, police received a couple of calls regarding extremely loud music being played from an unknown destination in Gullane. Details were passed on to the East Lothian Noise Team.
- On Tuesday 14 May, police were called regarding persons flytipping at Sheriffhall Farm on the previous Saturday. Police attended and noted details of the persons and vehicle involved. Enquiries currently ongoing.

Other Incidents of note / relevant Community Council information

- During the month again there have been reports of person's hare coursing in the Ward area, if these persons are seen Police to be contacted and descriptions of persons, dogs and vehicle passed.
- Overnight on 27th April 2019 a motor vehicle in Gullane was damaged by having paint stripper or similar painted on it. Enquiries are ongoing
- Over the weekend 27th -29th April 2019 a heavy clay trough was stolen from outside a farmhouse in Dirleton, enquiries are ongoing.
- In the evening of Friday 10th May, police were called to a possible intruder on the building site at the old Fire Service Training School, Gullane. Police attended. Property secure, no persons within or seen
- In the evening of Friday 10th May, on the A198 between Duncar Road to Drem, police detected a strong smell of drugs from a vehicle. Vehicle was stopped and the driver found to be in possession of a small amount of cannabis. Male driver issued with Recorded Police Warning.
- On Thursday 16th May at The Village Coffee House, Gullane, a counterfeit £20 note was passed. Police attended and a description of male suspect given. Enquiries still ongoing.
- In the late evening of Friday 24th May, police were called to a possibly drunk male walking along the A198 near to Gosford House. Police attended and traced the male. Male checked out. Positive drugs search, male issued with ticket and returned to his home address.
