Ward Priorities

1. Road Safety

- On 10th April, whilst police were on mobile patrol, a driver of a white van was caught driving without due care and attention. Male driver spoken to and reported on summons.
- In the morning of 21st April, police stopped male driving a vehicle on the A198 Aberlady. Checks revealed there was no insurance held on the vehicle. Driver cautioned and charged with offence and vehicle seized.
- On 22nd April, a report of an ongoing road rage incident was reported. Police attended and spoke with both parties. A male driver was issued with an ASBO.

2. Antisocial Behaviour

- Police were called to a male causing a disturbance in Gullane in the early hours of Friday 27th March. Police attended, no trace of male. Male has been identified and to be traced and spoken with in regards to vandalism.

Other Incidents of note / relevant Community Council information

- In the evening of Friday 3rd April, whilst on routine patrol at Yellowcraigs Country Park car park, a vehicle was seen exiting the car park. Due to Covid19 regulations the vehicle was stopped where a smell of drugs was detected emanating from the vehicle. A search of the vehicle and occupants was conducted where a quantity of herbal cannabis and cannabis resin was found. The passenger admitted ownership and reported accordingly.
- Overnight between 9th and 10th April a bird table was stolen from a garden in West Fenton Gait, Gullane. Details taken and enquiries ongoing.
- It was reported to police that on dates between 7th and 14th April, chicken feed and 3 chickens were stolen from a field near Dirleton. Details taken and enquires ongoing.
- In the evening of Friday 17th April, police were called to beach at Yellowcraigs where a suspected unexploded WW2 bomb was found. Due to the time of night, the informant and police were unable to locate the suspected bomb. A search continued in the morning where it was found. EOD attended and assessed the item which was a solid lump of metal. Item now removed.
- On Monday 20th April, police were called to the beach at Yellowcraigs where a suspected unexploded bomb was found. Police attended, cordon put in place. EOD attended and one controlled explosion carried out.
- On Thursday 23rd April, police were called to a possible decomposing human arm at Gullane beach. Police attended and sent picture to bones specialist who confirmed that it was bones of a seal.
