Ward Priorities

1. Road Safety

- The Towns in East Lothian have now a 20mph speed limit which is hoped will reduce the issues many have with speeding.

2. Antisocial Behaviour

- On Saturday 11th July, police were advised of large groups of youths gathering in wooded area at Yellowcraigs. Police attended and spoke with several groups of youths. Suitable advice given.
- On Saturday 11th July, whilst on mobile patrol, police observed a group of youths consuming alcohol, stopped and spoken to. No alcohol left on them, nothing seized. Details of youths noted. Advice given.
- On 25th July several youths were spoken to regarding being in the grounds of Gullane Primary school.

Other Incidents of note / relevant Community Council information

- In the early hours of Thursday 25th June, a male was spoken to in Main Street, Gullane and his vehicle searched where 2 bags of white powder were found. Driver reported for summons.
- On Thursday 2nd July police attended to a possible unexploded ordnance. Cordon put in place, EOD attended who carried out a safe explosion.
- In the early hours of Monday 6th July, at Longniddry Bents car park, police observed a vehicle and on approach to vehicle detected a smell of cannabis coming from within. Police carried out a search where 2 bags of herbal matter were found. RPW issued to both parties.
- Numerous calls regarding wild camping in the area. Advice given to wild campers and East Lothian Ranger also advised for their attention.
- On Wednesday 7th July at 1645 hours, a theft occurred at business premises on Lochhill Farm where items were stolen from an unlocked shed. CCTV available and enquiries ongoing.
- On Friday 10th July, a minor assault occurred whilst complainer was on a bus heading out of North Berwick. CCTV available. Enquiries ongoing.
- On 15th July in Main Street, Gullane, police issued a police warning to a female for being in possession of a controlled drug namely herbal cannabis.
- On Wednesday 29th July persons were seen on a roof in Manse Road Dirleton ripping tiles from a roof persons had left the scene on Police arrival, all tiles recovered. A crime report for a vandalism has been raised.
