I am aware that there may be more incidents but, due to the nature of these, or ongoing investigations, I cannot give full details.

They are broken down in terms of the agreed priorities for the ward.

Ward Priorities

1. Road Safety

- On Sunday 8th November, a male was charged with drink driving in the Gullane area.
- On Saturday 7th November, on the A198 Whitekirk, a vehicle was seized and the driver charged with having no insurance.
- On Sunday 8th November, police observed a motorcycle on the A198 driving at excess speed through Aberlady with disregard for other road users. Driver issued with a conditional offer.

2. Antisocial Behaviour

- In the evening of Friday 13th November, police were called to attend to a possible party ongoing on Gullane beach playing loud music and possibly breaching Covid19 guidelines. Police attended where there were 6 youths in total, all socially distanced having a drink. They tidied up and moved on.

3. Housebreaking

- Between 2100 hours on Monday 23rd and 0730 Tuesday 24th November, the outdoor buildings in the Livery Yard at Ballencreeff have been broken in to. Police attended and enquiries ongoing.

4. Parking – October 2020 issued by ELC

- Aberlady - 20 PCN's (20 outside Nature Reserve)
- Gullane - 82 PCN's (76 at Gullane Bents & 0 Marine Terrace)
- Yellowcraigs - 73

Other Incidents of note / relevant Community Council information

- In the early hours of Monday 2nd November, a catering trailer at Fenton Barnes Retails Village was set alight causing minor damage. The same trailer was targeted again in the early hours of Wednesday 4th. Police made aware and enquiries are ongoing.
- On Wednesday 4th November, police were called to an area of beach at Longniddry Bents after a report of a man's body being found. Officers issued an appeal to help identify the man who has now been identified as a 79 year old resident from the local area. No suspicious circumstances.
- On Wednesday 18th November, it was reported that a child's bike was stolen whilst left lying in the front garden at a property in Haddington Road, Aberlady. Details obtained and enquires ongoing.
- On Wednesday 18th November, a male stole alcohol from the Co-Op at Gullane. Male caught on CCTV and enquiries ongoing to identify him.
- In the early hours of Saturday 21st November, whilst on routine patrol, police observed a vehicle parked in Longniddry Bents Car Park where a male was lying asleep in the rear seats. On speaking to the male, a strong smell of cannabis was detected. Male detained and vehicle searched where a small bag of green herbal matter and a grinder was found. RPW issued to male.
- On Saturday 21st November, whilst on routine patrol, a smell of cannabis could be detected whilst approaching a car parked in Longniddry Bents Car Park. Occupants detained and a male thereafter issued with a RPW for possession of drugs.
- On Tuesday 24th November 2 pedal cycles were found near to Adberlady Parish Church thought to have been abandoned, they were collected by Police as found property and lodged at Haddington Police Station.
